




Bukit Lima Nature Reserve

### Mukah

Mukah town is perfectly laid out with commercial buildings and hotels. The bustling market and bazaar along the wharf are worth a visit. Here, the fishermen unload the day's catch in the early hours of the morning. The market will also be teeming with an astounding variety of seafood and shellfish.

### Local Delicacy


No. 44 Kampung Tellian Tengah 96400 Mukah, Sarawak



Linut is made from sago flour which is mixed with room temperature water first before adding hot water until it becomes gooey and sticky. It can be eaten with sambal or tempoyak...




Umai (Melanay Ceviche) is made from raw fish cured in lime juice and spiced with shallots and chilli...





Dalat Tua Pek Kong Temple, Pekan Dalat, 96300 Dalat, Sarawak

Situated on the Oya River, this town makes an interesting half-day outing from Mukah or a stopover for visitors travelling by express boats from Sibu. One of the finest Kelidieng burial pole is found across the wharf. There are a number of small coffee shops and open-air cafes.

## Sarikei

A bustling riverside town and a major transit point on the Pan-Borneo Highway and the Rajang River. Visitors from the north and central region travelling to the southern region of Sarawak or vice versa will pass through Sarikei town. The town's icon is a sculpture of the pineapple, which is proudly displayed right in

A well-preserved longhouse made entirely of belian (ironwood). This longhouse offers an exciting homestay option. There are four waterfalls including Pala Musuh Waterfall in the vicinity ranging from 30 minutes to an hour's walk away...

You can experience longhouse living at its best by observing their daily activities, take boat rides or indulge in a night walk...

This fort was built by the Brooke government to hinder attacks from Iban foes. It was originally built from bamboo and was later replaced with belian (ironwood)...

# Kapit

The express boat that travels to Kapit makes its first stop in Song.







The bustling market situated right in the centre of the town and within walking distance from the express boat. It is one of the best markets for jungle produce, fruits, vegetables, exotic freshwater fish and wild meat ...





### Kanowit

The town's name is derived from the name of the earliest ethnic group settling along the Kanowit River. It takes 45 minutes to reach the town by land transport and an hour by boat from Sibu.

One of the oldest settlements in Sibu comprising of 9 longhouses dating from the 18th century and it's a 40 minute's ride from Siby by boat or vehicle ...



alan Kubu, 96700 Kanowit, Sarawak

Named after Rajah James Brooke's sister, this fort was built in 1851 with the aim of checking raids by the Iban's and others who had settled down by the river and was used as prison cells...

Heroes' monument built to commemorate the service and sacrifice of their border scouts, who were killed in 1971 during the communist rebellion...
