

# Sarawak

Located on the north-western shore of the Island of Borneo is Sarawak, the largest region of Malaysia. A beautiful land coloured in peace and tradition, Sarawak is a prime destination for travel nomads seeking untouched culture, exhilarating adventure and breath-taking nature.

As a part of Malaysia, Sarawak is a peaceful and safe place for travel, suited for large groups or single travellers alike. With thick jungles a few steps from luxurious resorts and modern amenities, it is the perfect location for a wide range of experiences. As these two worlds collide, the people of Sarawak meet in the middle, with a mixture of modern savvy and proudly-kept traditions, wild nature lining organised infrastructure and old-fashioned hospitality mixed with connectivity.

Revealing a side of Asia unlike anywhere else, Sarawak offers an alternative for those seeking humble authenticity far from the tourist-trap clichés, whether their visit to Sarawak is a complement to a trip to Peninsular Malaysia and neighbouring countries, or a journey of discovery all on its own.

## Kuching



The unique city of Kuching is the capital of Sarawak and has a romantic charm and unlikely history like no other.

The residents of Kuching take great pride in their fascinating city and welcome visitors warmly and in a genuine way that allows them to go about their business in a relaxed manner –that hasn't changed over two centuries.

To truly experience this incredible city is to go beyond creature comforts which requires you to put your most comfortable shoes on, take to the streets (and the water), and simply join in. Like all towns and cities in Borneo, the focal point of Kuching and the reason for its existence is the river. Hiring a sampan to meander slowly up and down the Sarawak River is the best way to get your first impression of Kuching.

It is also the ideal base from which to go exploring the national parks and nature reserves to visiting longhouses, sampling its tantalising food, and shopping for beautiful handicrafts, Kuching is the cat's meow.

## Sibu



Sibu is the largest port and commercial centre in the Rejang Basin and the gateway to Central Sarawak. Located at the confluence of the Rejang and Igan Rivers, approximately 130 km from the South China Sea, Sibu is a thriving modern town with a vibrant centre and a bustling, crowded waterfront.

To visitors, Sibu feels more down-to-earth than relaxed Kuching. There is still something of the pioneer style about the town, and its people are direct, plain-speaking and assertively friendly. Of course, their smiles may be partly due to the belief that Sibu has more millionaires per capita than any other city in Borneo.

The mighty Rejang, almost a mile (1,600 km) long, is the dominant feature of the town, and a room with a river view is highly recommended for vibrant impressions of waterfront life. The river is a source of constant activity, with ocean-going vessels maneuvering delicately between speeding express boats, battered river launches and tiny sampans. Rejang sunsets can be truly spectacular.

Sibu is not only fascinating in its own right; with its excellent road, air and river transport links it is also the ideal jumping-off point for exploring the whole Rejang Basin, from the coastal town of Mukah to the furthest reaches of the Upper Rejang, over 600km upriver.

## Bintulu



Bintulu Town is situated 650km from Kuching and 215km from Sibu and Miri. There are several daily flights from Kuching, Sibu and Miri. It is also well connected to Mukah in the south and Miri in the north by the coastal road system. The express bus services provide comfortable and cheaper means of transportation to and from all major towns in Sarawak.

## Miri



Miri is Sarawak's second-largest city and the gateway to the state's fascinating northeast region. A rapidly expanding business, commercial centre and the home of Sarawak's oil industry, Miri is located in Northeast Sarawak close to the Brunei border.

The city is fast becoming an important tourism destination in its own right, in line with its official designation; "Miri – The Most Liveable Resort City". The city has an excellent range of hotels in all price categories and a wide selection of food outlets. Combine this with a vibrant nightlife, bustling native markets, several popular beaches nearby and even a top-class marina, and Miri makes an ideal base for exploring the National Parks, the offshore reefs and the other natural and cultural attractions of Northeast Sarawak. It is also a great place to relax for a few days after the rigours of jungle trekking.

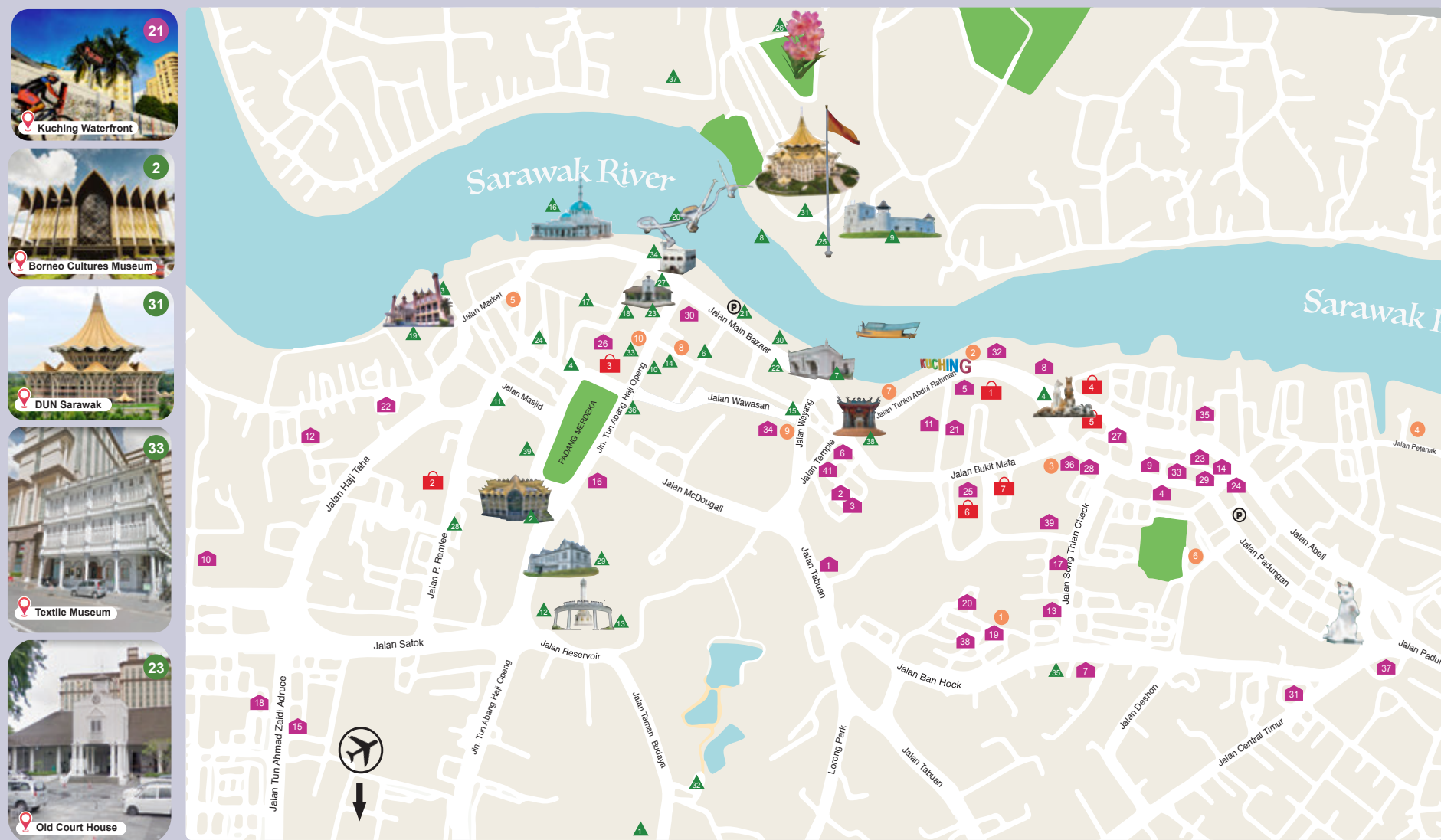


**SARAWAK TOURIST MAP**
